Modern browsers save on system resources by putting tabs into an inactive state after a certain amount of time. When accessed, the tab will reload for the most up-to-date information.

For Liberty, this means the system will log you out and you would need to log in again.

To prevent this, we can exclude the site.

## Chrome


- Go to <a href="mailto:chrome://settings/performance">chrome://settings/performance</a>


- Select Add
